From the Deacons: This week's offering is for **Dorion Bible Camp.** Dorion Bible Camp is a CSSM Ministries camp. CSSM ministries is an interdenominational organization that owns 43 camps across Canada as well as having many church plants and Bible clubs. Dorion has been in operation for 63 years this year and is a camp that seems to be reaching primarily non-churched campers. Our goal is to make sure that each camper who comes hears the gospel message of Christ and has opportunity to give their life to Him. We are currently running 6 weeks of overnight camp here on the camp property and 1 week of a canoe trip to the White Otter Castle area at the end of the summer. Our camper ages range from 7-18 years old. DBC has many exciting activities and programs that make our camp a great place to be in the summer. One of the newest additions is our 40 ft. 4 sided climbing tower with zip line. We also offer archery, crafts, sports, canoeing, drama, outdoor cooking, kub kars, and much more. One of our biggest needs this year is staff - particularly cabin staff for both guys and girls. We are looking for people who have a relationship with Christ, who love kids and want to serve in a camp setting. You have to be at least 16 to be an assistant and 18 to be a leader. We need lifeguards, cooks, 1st aiders and someone to be in the office for the summer to answer the phone and run the tuk shop. A second need is campers :) A third need is people who will commit to pray for this ministry through the summer.
